**Did you know?** - When you understand that most medical terms are derived from Latin or Greek, it's easier to figure out what the words mean by breaking them down. The key is practicing the Latin and Greek root words on your own.

Some games that work magic on medical term memorization are:

**Jeopardy** – Make a Jeopardy board and ask medical terminology questions, or make index cards with categories based on Latin or Greek words or body parts; then, have a set of cards for the descriptions of those medical terms with the answer (in question format) on the back. You can play Jeopardy as individuals or as teams, depending on how many people are involved in the game. There are Jeopardy templates online at [jeopardylabs.com](http://jeopardylabs.com).

**Bingo** – Have one person read the definitions, while players mark the medical terminology on their boards. The first one to get a correct line of A&P terms calls "Bingo!" and gets a prize.

**Pictionary** – Make it a race to draw pictures of human anatomy and then label the parts correctly.
