Frequently Asked Questions

How often should I visit the dentist?

For most people, dentists recommend having a cleaning and checkup twice a year - every six months, to be precise. However, depending on your specific oral health needs, we may recommend you visit your dentist more often than that.

How can I prevent oral disease like caries?

In addition to deep cleaning your teeth, your dentist and hygienist will perform a thorough oral exam (which may include x-rays) to determine whether you have, or are developing, any oral health problems.

There are many problems that your dentist and hygienist will be able to identify early on that you may not, because they require a trained eye and x-rays to spot. These include cavities, gingivitis, and even oral abnormalities like tumors and cysts.

How many times a day should I brush my teeth?

The American Dental Association (ADA) recommends brushing your teeth twice a day, in the morning and evening with soft-bristled brush for a minimum of 2 minutes each time making sure you brush every tooth and clean between your teeth once a day with a dental floss. Cleaning or flossing between your teeth helps remove plaque and flood particles that often get stuck under your gum line and between your teeth.

Why should I get the Influenza (flu) vaccine?

CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get an influenza (flu) vaccine every year. Flu vaccine has been shown to prevent millions of illnesses, tens of thousands of hospitalizations and thousands of deaths each year.

This vaccine can protect you and your family from getting sick from flu. By getting the vaccine today, you will be protecting yourself and the people around you who may be more vulnerable to serious flu illness, like your children and parents.

A flu vaccine cannot cause flu infection. The most common side effects of an influenza vaccine are mild, like redness, swelling, soreness, or a low-grade fever for a flu shot. This should go away within a few days.

Flu activity is going to start to pick up, and CDC says to expect more cases in the coming months. That is why we want to make sure you are helping protect yourself and your loved ones. It is important to get vaccinated this season because flu vaccination can reduce potential flu illnesses, doctor visits, and missed work and school due to flu.
