

Health & Safety



As a ministry that offers shelter and healthcare, it has been our long-term practice to provide the highest standards of care to those we serve. Because our population is considered high risk and among the most vulnerable in Lancaster County - and because illness can spread quickly in a congregant living facility - we take extra measures of precaution to maintain a safe and healthy campus.

We continue to implement all state and CDC regulations for the prevention of the spread of sickness and disease (including COVID-19). We also receive regular updates from the PA Department of Health and the CDC, and we are working in close partnership with Penn Medicine and Lancaster General Health to evaluate best practices for prevention.

We respectfully ask that all volunteers adhere to the health guidelines and safety protocols listed below.

As of September 16, 2021

- Staff and Volunteers are currently required to wear a face mask*
- Temperature screenings are not currently required prior to volunteering *
- Hand washing and good hygiene continue to be encouraged
- Volunteers should not come to campus if they feel sick
- Volunteers should not come to campus if they are within 14 days of experiencing COVID-like symptoms or if they are awaiting results of a COVID-19 test
- Volunteers should not come to campus if they are within 14 days of having contact with a known COVID-19 patient or person awaiting results of a COVID-19 test
- Volunteers should call/email their ministry area leader or the Volunteer Office immediately if they develop COVID-like symptoms and suspect they might have exposed someone on campus when volunteering. Do not come to campus.
- Disposable face masks and gloves are available upon request
